They are content to go on in an easy frame of mind, which does not challenge them to think other than material things, or else they fear that going to church will make them lose their material joys and pleasures.

Question 5: How does the Church service as a whole appeal to you?

The service appeals to me only as a means to worship. It is not worship in itself. It gives me joy because it affords the opportunity of joining with other souls in reverencing a supreme Deity.

Question 6: What criticisms or suggestions can you make that would seem to you to make the service more appealing to young people?

I do not think any service, no matter how attractive, nor how appealing could long hold young people. The desire to worship cannot be instilled by ceremony, or else we would all belong to the Catholic Church. The impulse must come from the heart, and be born of an experience of the soul with God.

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
