Outline: As main lines of 19th century became clear we see the development of the strain of scientific spirit and investigation. He sat humbly at nature's feet and learned. Simple. Loyal to Truth. Christian in spirit but not in name.

On the other hand, the commercial development, political + social has retained the name "Christian" but violated its ethics, resulting in the collapse of civilization in the world war.
