Abbie Goldberg is an author, educator, researcher, and speaker, and an international expert on LGBTQ-parent families. She is Professor of Psychology and Director of Women's and Gender Studies at Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts. She is the author and editor of six award-winning books, including *Gay Dads* (NYU Press, 2012) and *LGBTQ Divorce and Relationship Dissolution* (Oxford, 2019), and she has authored over 115 peer-reviewed journal articles. Her newest book is *Open Adoption and Diverse Families* (Oxford, 2019).

Dr. Goldberg has spoken nationally and internationally on LGBTQ-parent families, adoptive families, and related topics. She has given plenary and keynote lectures and workshops to audiences as diverse as the White House, heads of independent schools, therapists, medical students, educators, adoption agency professionals, and religious leaders. Dr. Goldberg has also served as a consultant to numerous organizations and individuals, and provided productivity coaching and writing support to graduate students and professionals.

She has been interviewed hundreds of times by the media, with commentary printed in outlets such as the *New York Times*, *Parenting* magazine, *Real Simple* magazine, the *Financial Times*, *USA Today*, the *Boston Globe*, *MSNBC*, and others.

She received her BA in psychology from Wesleyan University, and an MA in psychology and a Ph.D. in clinical psychology from the University of Massachusetts Amherst. She has received research funding from numerous private foundations as well as the National Institutes of Health. In addition to teaching undergraduate courses in sexuality, gender, and diverse families, Dr. Goldberg also teaches in the Ph.D. program in clinical psychology, and mentors doctoral students in clinical and developmental psychology.
